- Social Workers with LCSW or LMSW (within a year of LCSW eligibility)
- Psychiatric Nurse Practitioners licensed in NY State
- Licensed Mental Health Counselors with a Masters degree
- Advanced students in relevant degree programs

Requirements for Matriculation

- Personal training analysis
- Course work and psychoanalysis of patients under supervision (timing determined with faculty advisor)

About

Established in 1980 and chartered by the Board of Regents of the State University of New York, the Manhattan Institute for Psychoanalysis (MIP) offers comprehensive psychoanalytic training programs. The theoretical framework is contemporary interpersonal psychoanalysis as embedded in the broader relational tradition.

Training Programs

Certificate Program in Psychoanalysis

- **Curriculum**: Four years of formal coursework plus a fifth year of elective study. The curriculum includes classical psychoanalytic thought, object relations, interpersonal thinking, intersubjectivity, and contemporary relational models.
- **Schedule**: Two courses per trimester. Classes meet Thursday evenings from 6:30-8:00 PM and 8:30-10:00 PM, for ten weeks per trimester.

Requirements:

- Eligibility: Open to qualified, licensed mental health providers (psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, psychiatric nurses).
 Outstanding candidates who don't meet these requirements may be considered individually.
- **Personal Analysis**: Required throughout training, minimum of 300 hours at a frequency of three times per week (beginning no later than September of second year).
- **Supervised Experience**: Candidates work with at least two patients in psychoanalysis, beginning in first year. Minimum of 200 hours of individual supervision with at least three supervisors over five years.

- Clinical Requirements:

- One patient seen twice weekly (minimum 300 hours), beginning by January of first year
- One patient seen three times weekly (minimum 400 hours), beginning by September of second year
- Licensed candidates must carry minimum of two clinic patients throughout training
- Costs (2024-25):
 - **Tuition**: \$3,500 per year for first four years, then \$200 per trimester until graduation
 - **Application Fee:** \$75 (non-refundable)
 - **Supervision**: \$75 per session (paid to Manhattan Institute)
 - **Personal Analysis**: Fee determined with analyst
 - **Financial Assistance**: Need-based financial assistance and scholarships available, including equity-based scholarships for BIPOC candidates
- Application Deadline: June 1 for the following academic year

 Service

- **Supervision**: After two semesters of psychoanalytic practice in small group supervision, clinically experienced students may apply to begin individual supervision
- Schedule: Classes meet in the evening to accommodate students' work schedules
- **Eligibility**: Open to mental health professionals and those from other backgrounds
