


# **Building a Wiki Directory of NYC Psychoanalytic Training Institutes**

#### Introduction

The landscape of psychoanalytic training in New York City presents a rich yet complex environment for prospective candidates and practitioners alike  $\frac{[1]}{2}$ . With approximately 34 institutes operating across the metropolitan area, navigating this landscape can be challenging without a comprehensive resource  $\frac{[3]}{2}$ . This report outlines a wiki structure designed to organize and present current information about these institutes, building upon the 2014 directory while bringing the data up to date for 2025  $\frac{[4]}{2}$ .

The proposed wiki structure follows a systematic organization that allows users to access information through multiple pathways [6]:


# **Main Directory Pages**

# **Institute Navigation Methods**

Users can browse institutes through several categorization schemes [6]:

- Alphabetical Listing Traditional A-Z directory of all 34 institutes [6]
- Theoretical Orientation Grouping by primary theoretical approach [6]
- Geographic Location Manhattan, New Jersey, Long Island, and Westchester [6]
- Licensure Eligibility Which programs qualify for NY State LP credential [6]
- Degree Requirements Doctoral-only vs. masters-level programs [6]

# **Institute Profile Template**

Each institute has its own dedicated page following a standardized template for consistency [8]. The template includes:

- 1. **Overview** Brief introduction to the institute and its mission [8]
- 2. Contact Information Address, phone, website, email, admissions contact [8]
- 3. Status and Accreditation Current status, license eligibility, accrediting bodies  $\frac{[8]}{}$
- 4. **Training Programs** Detailed information about available programs [8]
- 5. **Theoretical Orientation** Description of the institute's theoretical approach [8]
- 6. Admissions Requirements Minimum degree requirements and application process [8]
- 7. Special Features Unique aspects that distinguish the institute  $\frac{[8]}{}$
- 8. **History** Founding and significant developments [8]
- 9. **Community and Culture** Description of the institute's environment [8]
- 10. **Testimonials** Quotes from graduates or current candidates [8]
- 11. **Related Institutes** Links to institutes with similar orientations [8]

This template creates consistency while allowing for the unique features of each institute to be highlighted [9].

# **Key Findings from Research**

#### Institute Status

Analysis of the 2014 directory compared with current research indicates that most institutes from the original list remain active, though some have evolved in significant ways [10]:

- The vast majority of institutes (33 out of 34) from the 2014 directory remain operational in 2025 [10]
- Several institutes have expanded their programs, particularly in response to the NY State Licensed Psychoanalyst (LP) credential established in 2002 [2]
- Many now offer hybrid or online learning options, accelerated by the pandemic [6] [11]
- At least one new institute (Metropolitan Institute for Training in Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy) has emerged since the 2014 directory [10]

# **Theoretical Diversity**

The NYC psychoanalytic landscape represents remarkable theoretical diversity [3]:

- Classical/Contemporary Freudian approaches are maintained at institutes like NYPSI and CFS [12] [13]
- Interpersonal/Relational perspectives have grown in prominence, with four major institutes focused in this area [14] [15] [16]
- Modern Psychoanalysis (Spotnitz method) continues through institutes like CMPS [3]

# **Geographic Distribution**

While Manhattan dominates the landscape, training opportunities exist throughout the metropolitan area  $\frac{[22]}{}$ :

- 79% of institutes (27) are located in Manhattan [22]
- 9% (3) are based in New Jersey [22]
- 6% (2) are in Long Island [22]
- 6% (2) are in Westchester County [22]

This concentration reflects historical patterns but also presents accessibility challenges for those outside Manhattan [2].

# **Comparative Analysis of Institutes**

# **Training Requirements**

The wiki includes detailed comparisons of key factors that differentiate institutes [1]:

# 1. Minimum Degree Requirements:

- o Doctoral-level only (Columbia, NYU Postdoc) [23]
